## Reminders

For Health and Safety reasons, please do not allow children to ride on scooters/bikes in the school grounds.
Now the weather is better the children are regularly doing P.E. outside please make sure they have trainers in their bags.


Can we remind you that before school the children are the responsibility of the adult who brings them to school and should stay with them. Please do not let children play on the steps/ railings or grassy bank.
As we send water bottles home every Friday for washing, please remember to return them on Monday. As the weather is getting warmer the children need to rehydrate during the day.

## Attendance

You are required under the Education Act (1996) to ensure your child attends school regularly ( $95 \%$ is considered to be good attendance). If your child accrues 10 consecutive sessions of unauthorised absence you may be liable for a penalty notice (one days absence equals two sessions, a five day absence is equal to 10 sessions).

An unauthorised absence is any absence that the Head teacher has not given permission for or where an explanation has not been provided by the parents.
Parents must complete a request for Absence from School in Exceptional
Circumstances form and submit this to the school, allowing for sufficient time to enable the school to consider the request and inform the parents of the decision.
Where parents do not follow the school's procedures of submitting a request and simply remove their child without seeking prior approval, a warning may not be given and you may be liable for a penalty notice.
If your request is declined or you do not follow the correct procedure and you still take your child out of school each parent within your household may be issued with a $£ 60$ penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school. If a penalty notice remains unpaid after 21 days it will increase to $£ 120$. If after 28 days it remains unpaid you may be summonsed to appear before Magistrates to explain why your child has unauthorised school absences and you may be liable for a fine up to $£ 100$.
